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Internet Safety Presentation Recap for 4th and 5th Graders

On October 1, our 4th and 5th graders participated in an Internet Safety presentation. In the coming months, the Library Learning Commons will continue to cover these important topics during their computer sessions.

Key points from the presentation included:

- Encourage open communication with adults so kids feel comfortable asking for help in tricky situations, like when someone asks for personal information or if cyberbullying happens.
- Remind kids that followers aren't the same as friends, and to be careful about what they share online.
- Use social media to connect with people they know, but avoid talking to strangers.
- Help kids recognize identifying information in photos or usernames (such as school logos or street signs).
- Teach kids to stand up against cyberbullying by involving an adult—it's about helping the person being bullied, not punishing the bully.

For Parents:

Scott's main advice for parents was to start conversations early and talk often, so kids know how to handle these issues before they happen. Include your children in conversations about technology— many students know more than we do! Be aware of the content they are consuming online and try to avoid letting them watch YouTube or other online content alone with headphones.

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
WHS Presents Harry Potter and the Cursed Child

Once again, the CM Green Team will challenge our students to pack their lunches and snacks in environmentally friendly containers and pouches **during the week of October 21**. More details to come.

PACKING A WASTE FREE LUNCH/SNACK:

SAVES MONEY! Packing a reusable lunch and snack instead of disposables can save families over \$400 per student per school year.

BETTER FOR THE EARTH! Life cycle analyses show that reusables have significantly less environmental impacts than single-use disposables, including energy use and air pollution.

CUTS WASTE! Every year the average student tosses 67 pounds of packaging and 39 lbs of uneaten food. Lunch in reusable containers could save over 58 million pounds of trash statewide that we pay to haul and burn.
